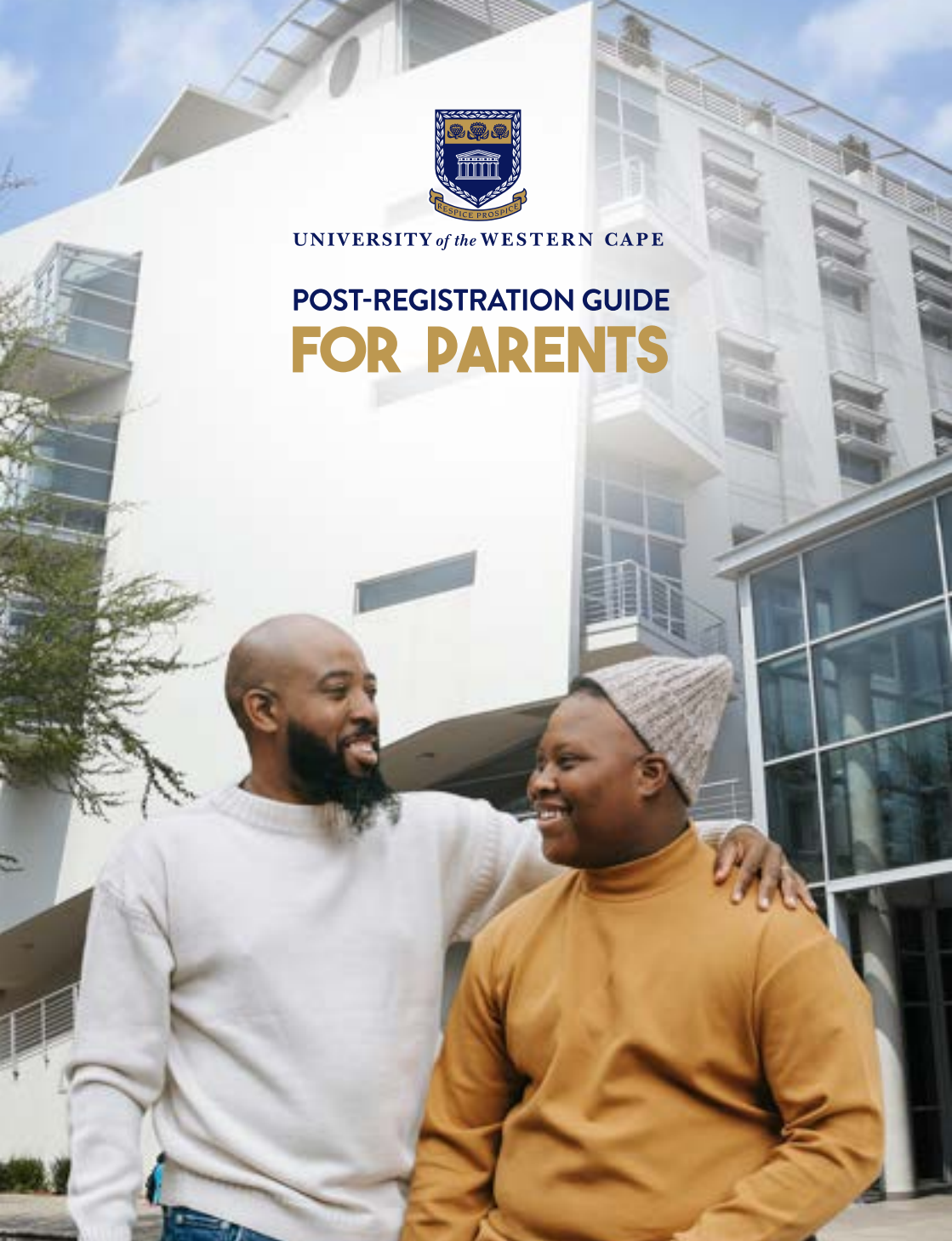

TUITION FEES

Tuition Fees are charged per module within a prescribed programme. Students who register for fewer modules as prescribed will be charged accordingly.

50% of the total outstanding Student fee account will be due by **30 April**.

100% of the total outstanding student fee account will be due by **31 July**.

- Accounts settled in full before the due dates will be eligible for settlement discounts calculated on current tuition fees and accommodation fees outstanding after all rebates have been credited.

DISCOUNTS ARE ONLY APPLICABLE TO SOUTH

****discounts are applicable on personal payments only, bursary and company payments do not qualify.**

FINANCIAL AID

NATIONAL STUDENT FINANCIAL AID SCHEME (NSFAS)

NSFAS is a statutory body, funded primarily by South Africa's National Department of Education, providing academically but financially needy students who wish to study at one of South Africa's public higher education institutions. PROTECTION OF PERSONAL INFORMATION ACT SUMMARY (POPIA)

The purpose of the POPIA is to ensure that all South African institutions conduct themselves in a responsible manner when collecting, storing, using, disclosing, processing and sharing another entity's personal information, by holding them accountable should they abuse or compromise your personal information in any way.

Under the POPIA, the University is legally required to comply with the POPIA principles. Under the POPIA, institutions are required to take reasonable steps to protect the personal information they hold, from misuse and loss and from unauthorised access, modification or disclosure.

USEFUL TIPS

FOR PARENTS DURING UNIVERSITY...

1. Be supportive, check in with the student to see if everything is going according to plan and if they are coping.
2. Always be vigilant. Take note of any unusual behaviour.
3. Encourage socialising, it would be beneficial if they found someone to relate to. Students should make their University life exciting and network to create support groups.
4. Independence is key, we prefer if students consult with us themselves if they are experiencing any uncertainties.
5. Every student experiences student life differently, encourage your child to be comfortable enough to find their own identity and support them in this.
6. Communication is extremely important. Students should inform their tutors and lecturers regarding any concerning issues. If Faculties are not aware of a situation, they will not be able to assist.
7. All communication regarding the student is done via their student email. Please remind students to keep an eye on their Gmail Account.
8. Everyone at UWC has free access to the Internet, but you will need to login with your Network Identity and password to gain access. Use of the Internet is also subject to our Information Technology Security policy.
